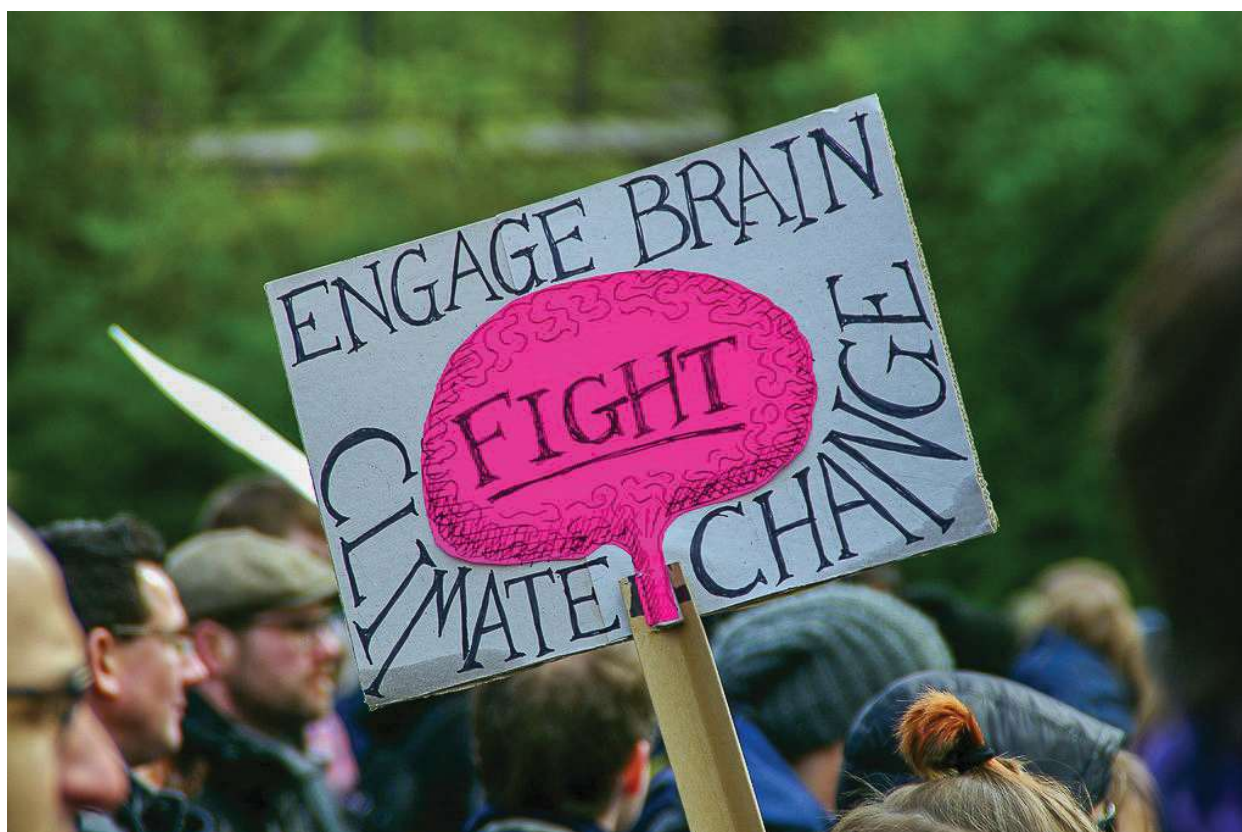




CLIMATE CHANGE

- AN ONLINE LEARNING PROGRAMME



Target group: National/local staff members of partner-and affiliated organisations in a Danida-supported project/programme – including the Danish Strategic Sector Cooperation. All applicants should be nominated by an officer or sector counsellor at the Royal Danish Embassy in their country or by a Danida-funded NGO.

Period: This online course will take place from October 14 – November 25, 2026. Within this timeframe, the course will begin with self-paced e-learning modules, which will lay ground for the following webinars and subsequent e-learning modules and assignments.

Recommended number of participants: 30 participants

Course description: This is a tailored online learning programme providing an overall understanding of climate change, its causes, consequences, and the main options for responses that we have: adaptation and mitigation. The course will consist of a blend of self-paced modules, individual and group assignments, as well as interactive webinars.

Learning objectives: By the end of this online course, participants will have gained knowledge of:

- the main greenhouse gasses, their sources and their effect on the climate,
- the impact of climate change,
- the two main response options to address the climate challenge – adaptation and mitigation – as well as the potential synergies between them,
- climate-compatible development and resilience to climate change,
- and you will have ideas for how to start taking action to address climate challenges in your own context.

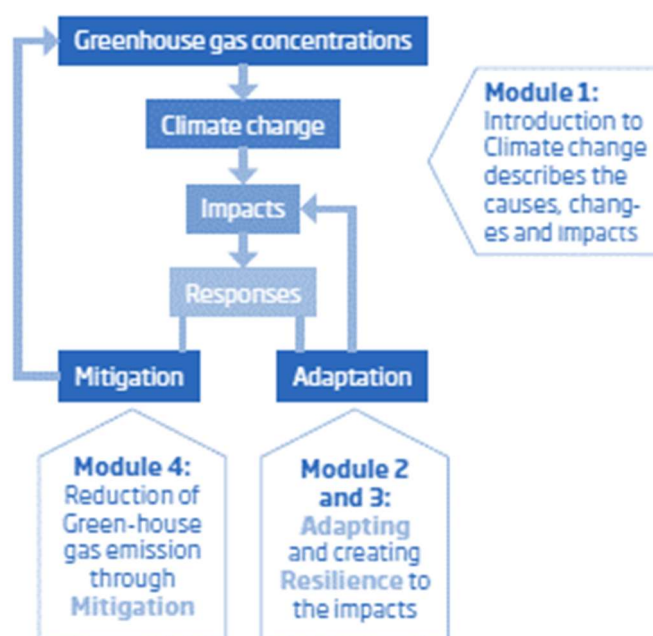
Course modules:

- 1) The changing climate;
- 2) Adaptation to climate change;
- 3) Climate resilience and Disaster Risk Reduction;
- 4) Climate change mitigation

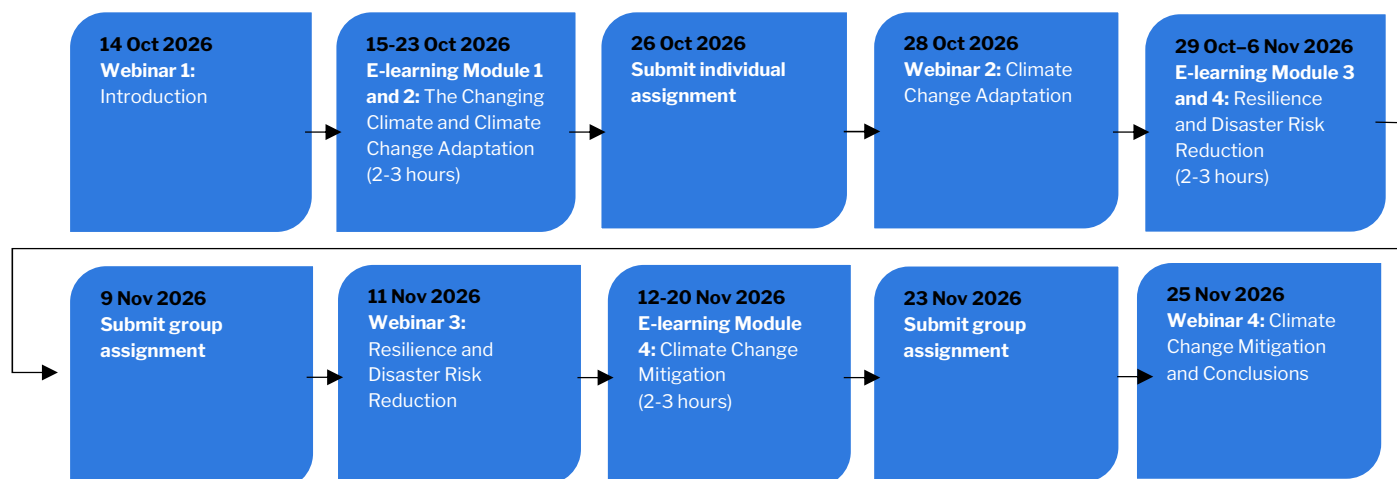
Module 1 will introduce the problem at hand: The increase in greenhouse gas emissions, the consequence (the changing climate) as well as the impacts of the changing climate.

Module 2 and 3 will look at ways we can adapt and create resilience to climate change.

Finally, *Module 4* will look at ways to reduce our emissions – or increase our uptake – of greenhouses gases through climate change mitigation.

A strong command of English is essential, as assignments must be prepared and presented in English. Additionally, group work will be conducted in English, and all participants will be required to give verbal presentations to the group and facilitators.
- **Commitment:** Completion of the online learning modules, participation in all sessions (unless prior approval by the course management) and timely submission of the course assignments, are required prerequisites to receiving the course certificate.
